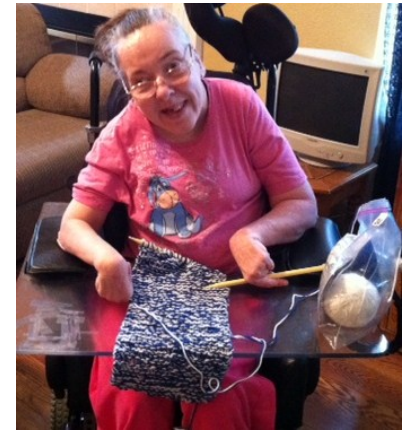


Super Scarves
